Belgic Confession, Article 7

We believe that this Holy Scripture contains the will of God completely, and that everything one must believe to be saved is sufficiently taught therein.

.. since the entire manner of service which God requires of us is described in it at great length, no one, even an apostle or an angel from heaven as Paul says, ought to teach other than what the Holy Scriptures have already taught us.

For since it is forbidden to add or subtract from the Word of God, this plainly demonstrates that the teaching is perfect and complete in all respects.

Therefore, we must not consider human writings - no matter how holy their authors may have been - equal to the divine writings; nor may we put custom, nor the majority, nor age, nor the passage of time or persons, nor councils, decrees, or official decisions above the truth of God.

Therefore, we reject with all our hearts everything that does not agree with this infallible rule...
